COVID-19 IN INDIA

In India, the COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in an increased caseload, hospitalization, and death surges, significantly affecting countless individuals, families, and communities and putting the public health system under tremendous strain.

In response, the Government of India launched the world's largest COVID-19 vaccination program in January 2021. Initial results were impressive, but challenges to equitable coverage with the COVID-19 vaccine persist, including low coverage among vulnerable, marginalized, and hard-to-reach populations; supply of vaccine exceeding demand; procurement and distribution barriers; vaccine hesitancy; and inequitable human resource coverage.

To accelerate vaccination uptake among vulnerable and hard-to-reach populations, the **MOMENTUM Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity** project is providing technical assistance to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MOHFW) to improve availability of vaccine doses and increase trust in and demand for COVID-19 vaccination

Project

The project has a mandate to provide technical assistance to the MOHFW at the national level, as well as to state health authorities to ramp up overall immunization services. John Snow India Pvt. Ltd. (JSIPL) is the lead partner in India for implementation, coordination, and achievement of project objectives.

Key Areas of Support

INCREASING VACCINE UPTAKE AND OVERCOMING VACCINE HESITANCY

The project focuses on generating demand for the COVID-19 vaccine and Routine Immunization by designing interventions to increase awareness and enhance outreach. These interventions address state-specific issues, including the digital divide, vaccine hesitancy, lack of awareness, and ineffective community-facility linkages

The project works in 18 states and Union Territories



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The project's community mobilization efforts seek to increase immunization services uptake among the most vulnerable populations by engaging influential leaders and groups, such as women's and health professional associations, and building health worker capacity for interpersonal communication.

The project collaborates with private sector actors, including state chapters of the Confederation of Indian Industry, the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry, and the Indian Medical Association to support vaccinations within and outside their companies as part of corporate social responsibility initiatives.

Partnership In Rajasthan

The program partnered with six sub-awardees in the state and one of them is **Ladli Foundation** to ramp up COVID-19 vaccination in Rajasthan to support last-mile delivery and community engagement activities to improve the equitable coverage of vaccination services.

VACCINE PLANNING AND PRIORITIZATION FOR EQUITABLE DELIVERY

The project supports the MOHFW with activities to increase COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization coverage, especially for vulnerable and marginalized populations. This includes working with state health authorities to provide technical assistance to districts and sub-districts for analysis and use of coverage data to inform microplanning, design, and placement of service delivery sites to promote equitable access.

STRENGTHENING SUPPLY CHAIN FROM MANUFACTURER TO USER AND CLOSING GAPS IN LAST-MILE DELIVERY

The project promotes improved availability and monitoring of COVID-19 vaccines and Routine Immunization by strengthening supply chain management from the point of manufacture to last mile delivery. The project supports improved data quality and visibility to inform decisions about vaccine supply, including mapping public and private sector facilities, developing tailored approaches in each state, and leveraging available service delivery points for vaccine administration.

RESEARCH ON PRIORITY COHORTS TO MONITOR ADVERSE EVENTS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

The project is supporting a prospective study of adverse events of special interest in pregnant women in coordination with the existing adverse event monitoring and surveillance system

SHARING LEARNING AND DISSEMINATING BEST PRACTICES

The unprecedented nature of COVID-19 vaccine and Routine Immunization rollout necessitates rapid and continuous learning to inform adaptation. The project is working with MOHFW, state health authorities, and partners to support a learning agenda to improve vaccination program implementation and efficacy across India and around the globe

RAJASTHAN

As a part of District implementation plan under **Momentum Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity program**, Ladli Foundation trust has started its extension phase working in Jaipur, Nagaur, Dausa & Rajsamand districts of Rajasthan from the Month of Feb 2023 under the supervision and coordination with District Health Departments.

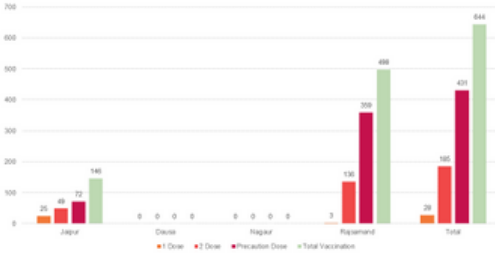

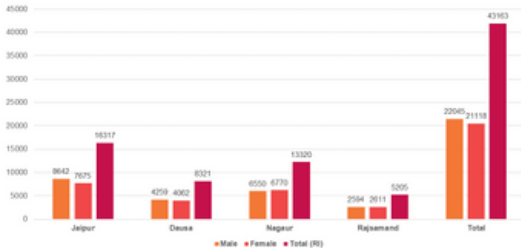

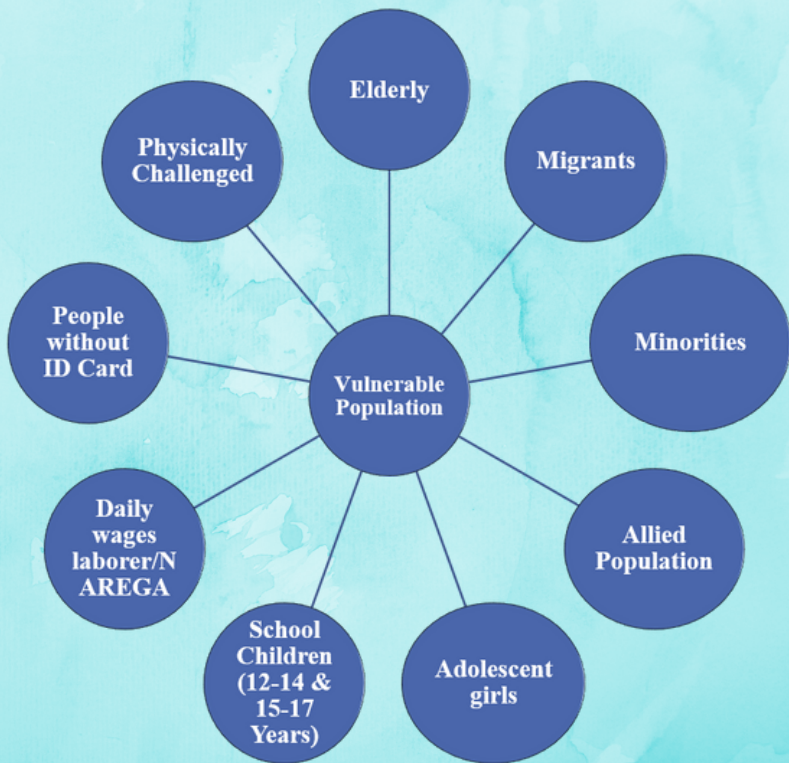

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MAJOR PROPOSED ACTIVITIES

District-level Meeting

A district-level meeting was held in the 4 implementing districts of Rajasthan namely Jaipur, Dausa, Nagaur, and Rajsamand. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the current scenario of COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization, the availability of vaccines, and plan for the maximum consumption of the vaccines. During the meeting, the work of the district teams towards increasing the uptake of overall immunization services was discussed. The meeting was attended by CMHOs, RCHOs, BCMOs, DRCHOs, and other government officials who provided their valuable suggestions and feedbacks to the teams.

Special Days/Drives – Community Level Generation Activities

In the four district, International Women’s Day (Special day) was celebrated for campaigning the M-RITE efforts and to boost vaccination numbers and leverage partnerships. The participants took out rally to create awareness on COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization in the district. Also, frontline health workers were felicitated for their exceptional work in the field and supported the team Ladli at hard-to-reach areas for vaccination. During the event frontline health workers, community women and adolescents were engaged. District officials CMHO, RCHO and other government officials along with state JSI team other officials witnessed the event

Special BYJU's Vaccination Camp

In all the four implementing districts, BYJU's special vaccination camp was organized. Students aged between 15-17 were vaccinated and a free BYJU's premium subscription of three years was given to them after the vaccination. The school is identified where a number of students were unvaccinated due to vaccine hesitancy. To break the hesitancy and to motivate students to get vaccinated, a special camp was organized where students were given free BYJU's subscriptions for 3 years. The actual cost for each subscription is worth Rs.60,000/- which was given free of cost to the students, which became an important tool due to which students could be mobilized for vaccination effectively.

This activity helped us to reach those students/parents who were against vaccination, and we could reach those students whose first vaccination dose was also not completed. The main goal of this activity is to increase the uptake of covid-19 vaccination among students by connecting them through digital learning.

Training & Workshops for Partners & Stakeholders

In two districts, training and workshops with partners and stakeholders were conducted to plan about reducing vaccine wastage before their expiry and increasing vaccination among the remotest areas. Approx. 256 frontline health workers were instructed to support the team in door to door survey and monitoring to increase the uptake of Routine Immunization. Overall, 80 partners and relevant stakeholders participated among which district magistrates, collectors, CMHOs, RCHOs, DEOs, school principals, and sarpanch were present.

Engagement of NREGA Workers in COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization

The Ladli project team has sensitized the NREGA workers about COVID-19 Vaccination and Routine Immunization. By travelling long distances to reach them and through various IPC activities, the team mobilized the NREGA workers and convinced them to get their children vaccinated. Special camps were also organized to administer the vaccine among them.

In four districts, activities like miking/munadi, announcements from rickshaw/auto, folklore and coordination with ASHA, USHA, MAS members in organizing community meetings to mobilize communities on the benefits of immunization services.

Story of Lohar Community

The Lohars of Rajasthan are nomads (Ghumakkar or Banjaras) who are always on the move and are involved in iron smelting work. Being socially and economically backward, the community was unaware of COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization



Ladli team has identified the Lohars dwelling in Rajsamand and Dausa, sensitized them about the Routine Immunization and COVID-19 appropriate behaviour, and mitigated their hesitancy towards taking the vaccine, through engagement activities and IPC sessions.

They were informed about benefits of the vaccination and the nearest CHCs administering the vaccine.

Story of Vanbagariya Community

The Vanbagariya community, located 18 kilometers from Nagaur, lives in isolation. They were originally meat eaters who hunted animals for a living. The community doesn't seek any medical facilities and avoids sending their children to school. However, as they began to come to the village for work, they are gradually integrating themselves into the community.



Team Ladli identified the community and visited it in the initial phase when they were strongly against administering the COVID-19 vaccination since they claimed "they would die if they did so." Therefore, during the extension phase the team visited again and did IPC sessions, community engagement events, and campaigns to sensitize the community on Routine Immunization. They were also taken to the nearest CHC for vaccination

Story of Sapera/Kalbeliya Community

The kalbeliyas, is a snake charmer community from Rajasthan, which performs Kalbeliya dance. They are renowned dancers, musicians and snake charmers and are identified as 'gypsies' in modern Indian culture. Kalbeliya is a nomadic community who sometimes introduces themselves as Saperas or Sadhu



Ladli team has identified the community residing in Dausa, and mobilized and sensitized them about COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization through engagement activities and IPC sessions. They were informed about benefits of the vaccination and nearest CHCs administering the vaccine. The team organised special camps in their community for immunization of their children

CELEBRATION ON SPECIAL DAYS

The Ladli team in each districts celebrated special days like International Women's day, World health day, Yoga day etc. to sensitize the masses about COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization. Special days are a time where huge number of people come together and it presented an opportune time to mobilize the people. By positively leveraging their religious and spiritual sentiments, the team motivated the over 20000 people to get vaccinated.

LEARNING AND EXPERIENCE SHARE MEETING

The one-day learning and experience-sharing meeting on "MOMENTUM - Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity" was organized on 28 June 2023 at Mount Abu, Rajasthan. The meeting aimed to promote knowledge exchange and discussions on transforming COVID-19 and routine immunization efforts.

The dissemination event brought together stakeholders from various sectors, including government officials, healthcare professionals, community leaders, and representatives from civil society organizations, to discuss the challenges and successes achieved under the project and to learn from each other's experiences which will help the country/state in dealing future pandemic effectively

The event featured keynote addresses by Dr. Raghuraj Singh, Project Director, Immunization, Dr. Devinder Sondhi, State Nodal Officer (Immunization) from Government of Rajasthan, Dr. G.K. Soni, Project Director-M-RITE and Ms. Anumegha Bhatnagar, Risk Communication Lead of M-RITE as well as panel discussions and interactive sessions on various topics related to the COVID-19 vaccination program and Routine Immunization. Participants had the opportunity to share their insights, ask questions, promote symbiotic learning and network with their peers for maximizing learning.



ACHIEVEMENTS

- The organization could present the work to the President of India, Ms. Droupadi Murmu in the president's house. The hon'ble President of India appreciated the work of the organization under this project.
- The organization received appreciation letters from CMHO and RCHO of Dausa and Jaipur district for the leadership and innovation in promoting routine immunization.
- The organization did district-level meetings in the four districts, where all the concerned health departments participated. During the meeting, the organization's work on ramping up COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization was shared, and with the support of CMHO and RCHO, a plan of action was formulated to reach the remotest and unvaccinated populations in the districts.
- World Immunization day was celebrated in all the four districts in which team could sensitize mass population and did outreach camps in the high risk areas.
- The organization was successful in conducting a workshop with partners and relevant stakeholders. Along with district health departments, around 150 frontline healthcare providers participated in the meeting.
- BYJU'S special vaccination camp was organized in the districts. During the camps, the students get vaccinated and are equipped with a free BYJU'S premium subscription for 3 years. Through these camps, the team was able to reach those students who were hesitant about COVID-19 vaccination and Tetanus and Diphtheria vaccination.
- The team with the local health department did micro-planning in all the four districts which could help the health system to increase the mobilization of beneficiaries.
- The organization engaged spiritual leaders to burst the myths and taboos associated with COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization to their followers.

CHALLENGES

- Parents are hesitant towards Routine Immunization of their children as there is a lot of misconception and misinformation towards vaccination
- There was the unavailability of COVID-19 vaccine, in the state of Rajasthan which has impacted the COVID-19 vaccination camps.
- Unavailability of ANM and LHV for the entire May month (due to strike) has affected the RI and reduced the rate of immunization in the whole Rajasthan.
- The COVID-19 vaccine was strongly opposed by a number of groups, notably the ragpickers and the Lohar Community.
- Certain religious, philosophical, or cultural beliefs conflict with the concept of vaccination
- Insufficient knowledge about the benefits and importance of routine immunization has contributed to the low demand for vaccination
- Factors such as long distances to vaccination centers, inconvenient operating hours, and inadequate transportation options hindered parents from seeking vaccinations for their children.
- Difficult geographies: Hard- to- reach areas, mining region and scattered habitat.

BEST PRACTICES

- Micro -planning and geo-tagging to understand the status of Routine Immunization within the community.
- Increased the students' COVID-19 vaccination and TD vaccination by providing a Free BYJUs premium subscription of 3 years.
- Identification of marginalized population living in slums , laborer and daily wagers based communities.
- Door to Door IPC sessions and outreach sessions within the community.
- Engaging frontline health workers, sarpanch, parents and multi-faith gurus to spread awareness about RI and COVID-19 vaccination.
- Support from other development partners and local NGOs for camp planning and mobilization.
- Public announcements to increase the awareness and help in information dissemination for the COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization in the community.
- Mobilization of people/children from hard to reach areas/rural areas to PHCs for vaccination.
- Exclusively Designed Nukkad Natak (Street plays) and Ratri chaupals (Evening community meetings) performed in all the blocks.
- Fun and reward- based activities like dance, music ,sports, and painting competition to effectively engage students for COVID-19 vaccination and Routine Immunization.
- To create long- lasting awareness, a variety of sensitization workshops and interactive sessions were organized.

FEW SUCCESS STORIES



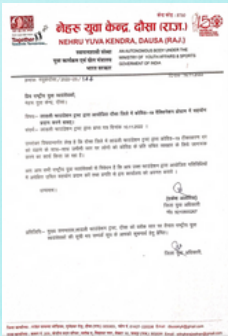
A woman of 38 years is a resident of Rajsamand District, Rajasthan. She belongs to an orthodox family where the family follows the pardahh system and women are not allowed to talk to the outsiders. Due to which her COVID-19 vaccination was pending. Additionally, she was scared to get vaccinated. To assist her with the vaccination administration and mitigate her fear, the Ladli team, along with the ASHA worker and ANM, went to her place and mobilised her. As a result of mobilization and counselling, she is proudly vaccinated.

This is the story of a single parent who belongs to the Sapera community. This community is secluded and therefore their information related to the immunization is very limited. Myths regarding vaccination are not uncommon in this community. They are, in fact, very prevalent. The team conducted various IPC activities and informed him the importance of immunization and the specific vaccinations his child required. We provided him with essential information and guidance to ensure that his child receives timely and appropriate immunization. Additionally, during our Routine Immunization camp in the Sapera Basti, we administered the necessary vaccinations to his child.



This is the story of a , a mother who opted for home deliveries for both her children, resulting in them not receiving a single vaccination. she , an illiterate daily wage laborer, remained unaware of the risks associated with home deliveries and the crucial importance of vaccinations for her children. By providing comprehensive information and support, we were able to alleviate Poonam's vaccine hesitancy and facilitate the immunization of all her children during the Routine Immunization camp held in Lohar Basti.

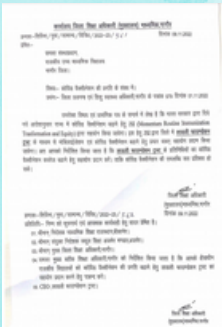

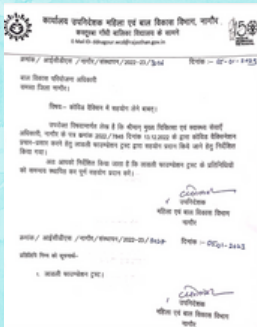
